Boarding facilities...

We are committed to providing the best facilities we can and have made major investments in the boarding houses in recent years. Presently there is accommodation for 200 students. We have 3 boarding homes categorised as the Brooke Hostel for form One girls, Budleigh girls' hostel forms Twos to Six and Blue Roof boys Hostel Forms Ones to Six. All 3 homes are a safe environment, creating a family unit atmosphere and belongingness

Boarders are housed throughout the term. We a have half term break six weeks into the term, learners have a weekend break at home.

House parents

The boarding facility is under overall direction of the headmaster and are supervised by Boarding Master or Boarding Matron in liaison with the residential staff and housekeeping personnel.

Additional will have teaching staff resident to help during study hours

The Boarding staff are loving compassionate and devoted. House parents play major parental role in grooming and moulding the learners to be in good and standing order taking personal interest in the learners' needs and well-being.

Laundry services

The school offers laundry service at premium per month. The laundry is taken twice per week under the care of a house parent. All laundry items must have name tags for easy identification.

Pocket money

For safe keeping boarder parents are encouraged to hand pocket money to the house parents who will maintain a small journal for cash in and out.

Tuck.

Learners can bring tuck in the form of potato crisps, noodles, cookies, juice, cereals, and milk et cetra. We do not allow Zapnax, tinned foods, candies and fizzy drinks

THE CHAPLAINCY

The Chaplain provides pastoral care and guidance to the learners. Runs programs on the culture of the school, the emotional and spiritual well-being of the students. He offers valuable support or students going through a difficult time. Also provides extra-curricular programs on Biblical studies for spiritual growth.

We provide a psycho pedagogic guidance service in our school that gives support to all school Levels. The Chaplain is a key piece in the functional development of the school. Their main task is to watch over and promote the students 'psychological development in all its components: psychomotor, intellectual, social, and affective emotional.

They undertake assessment and diagnosis activities, both individually and collectively, in order to detect possible learning problems and disorders. These are complementary actions to those carried out by teachers in classrooms Their aim is to increase students 'integral development and school performance respecting each one's different aspects.

Academic and professional guidance programs, vocational development programs, study strategies and techniques, academic performance improvement techniques, among others.
